
Locality Planning has moved on since previous updates. Several factors are driving this development:

Co-ordinated by Third Sector


- While originally developed in response to COVID, the Locality Hubs have extended their role in local community planning


To be effective, Place Plans must...

The Planning Act (Scotland) Act 2019

The Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 empowers communities to have their Place Plans considered by the Local Authority.

It is likely that the Council will be asked to produce an annual report demonstrating how it has supported communities to develop these Plans.

The Council has welcomed the support of its partners in responding to this challenge.

Key Issues

- Bringing coherence to partners' work around locality and Place
- It is important that communities see direct outcomes from the joint work of local partners and practical support to communities will be essential
